"PK asked for volunteers to establish a WP to consider the direction for the further future of EFSPI. The current 'Future' paper focuses on internal structure, website etc. and all this should be consolidated in 2001.

It was suggested that a list of EFSPI achievements would be useful and that the WP should look at gaps in the market with an aim to provide something different where EFSPI could make an impact. Also, a more structured approach to the FDA could be made. It was agreed that DM would lead the WP, assisted by PK and LD."
